Advanced Computer	Students explore advanced computer concepts. Digital projects include podcasts, videos, and websites.

Country and Western Dancing	Students learn basic 8-counts and steps in country and western partner dances and line dances.

Debate	Students work together to learn basic debating skills, researching and presenting on topics that are current and relevant.
Drama	Students experience an introduction to theatre with opportunities to participate in stage performances.
